



What is Financial literacy?

Financial literacy is an essential everyday life skill. It means being able to understand and negotiate the financial landscape, manage money and financial risks effectively and responsibly, and pursue and attain financial and lifestyle goals. *

*National Financial Literacy Strategy 2014 - 2017



What our data reveals

There is a wide gap between perceived and actual knowledge and understanding. Students


- * don't understand financial concepts such as the effect of compound interest and how to use credit wisely.
- * have limited knowledge of financial products such as insurance, superannuation and banking accounts.



7-10 Mathematics Curriculum

Present in 7-10 mathematics courses, including topics such as:

- Best buys
- Profit and loss
- Simple interest
- Compound interest
- Percentages and rates
- Financial contexts





ACARA General Mathematics

Applications of rates and percentages

- calculate weekly or monthly wage from an annual salary, wages from an hourly rate, including situations involving overtime and other allowances, and earnings based on commission
- calculate payments based on government allowances and pensions
- prepare a personal budget for a given income taking into account fixed and discretionary spending
- compare prices and values using the unit cost method
- apply percentage increase or decrease in contexts, including calculating percentage mark-ups and discounts, calculating GST, calculating profit or loss, and calculating simple and compound interest

Use of spreadsheets

use a spreadsheet to display examples of the above computations when multiple or repeated
computations are required; for example, preparing a wage-sheet displaying the weekly earnings of workers
in a fast-food store where hours of employment and hourly rates of pay may differ, preparing a budget, or
investigating the potential cost of owning and operating a car over a year



ACARA Essential Mathematics

FBF resources support many of the 'examples in context',:

- creating a budget for living at home and for living independently
- using timesheets, which include overtime, to calculate weekly wages
- using and interpreting tax tables
- converting between weekly, fortnightly and yearly incomes
- calculating commissions, including retainers from sales information
- using unit prices to compare best buys
- interpreting a range of graphical information provided on gas and electricity bills
- creating graphs to show the deductions from gross wages, such as tax, Medicare levy and superannuation
- compare and contrast costs of items from different retail outlets
- calculating food, clothing, transport costs per day, week or month



VCE - Financial and consumer mathematics

Present in VCE mathematics courses, including topics such as:

- identify credit options to best manage finances to meet short, medium and long terms goals, such as credit cards, personal loans
- taxation systems at the personal and business level
- the Australian taxation and superannuation system at a local (rates), state and national level
- financial systems and related calculations such as **personal taxation, GST and superannuation**
- income payments and calculations such as casual versus permanent employment, rates of pay, pay scales and payslips
- interest, repayments and relationship to amount borrowed, interest rates and time
- personal financial services and information such as borrowing, bills and banking
- income calculations including rates of pay and payslips
- personal taxation and superannuation
- taxation as a community and contribution to government
- fees and interest
- cost structures and related information associated with financial transactions

What happens in the game?

- The outcome of the game is the player's net worth after making a series of financial decisions over the virtual 26-week period.
- Game events are random for every game played.
- The positive and negative consequences of financial decisions made over an extended period are clearly demonstrated.



What happens in the game?

ESSI Money uses authentic scaffolding through the use of newspaper articles and quizzes, checking for understanding, and Howl (the how-to guy), to create a highly supportive learning experience.

- Quizzes are optional.


ESSI Money PLUS




